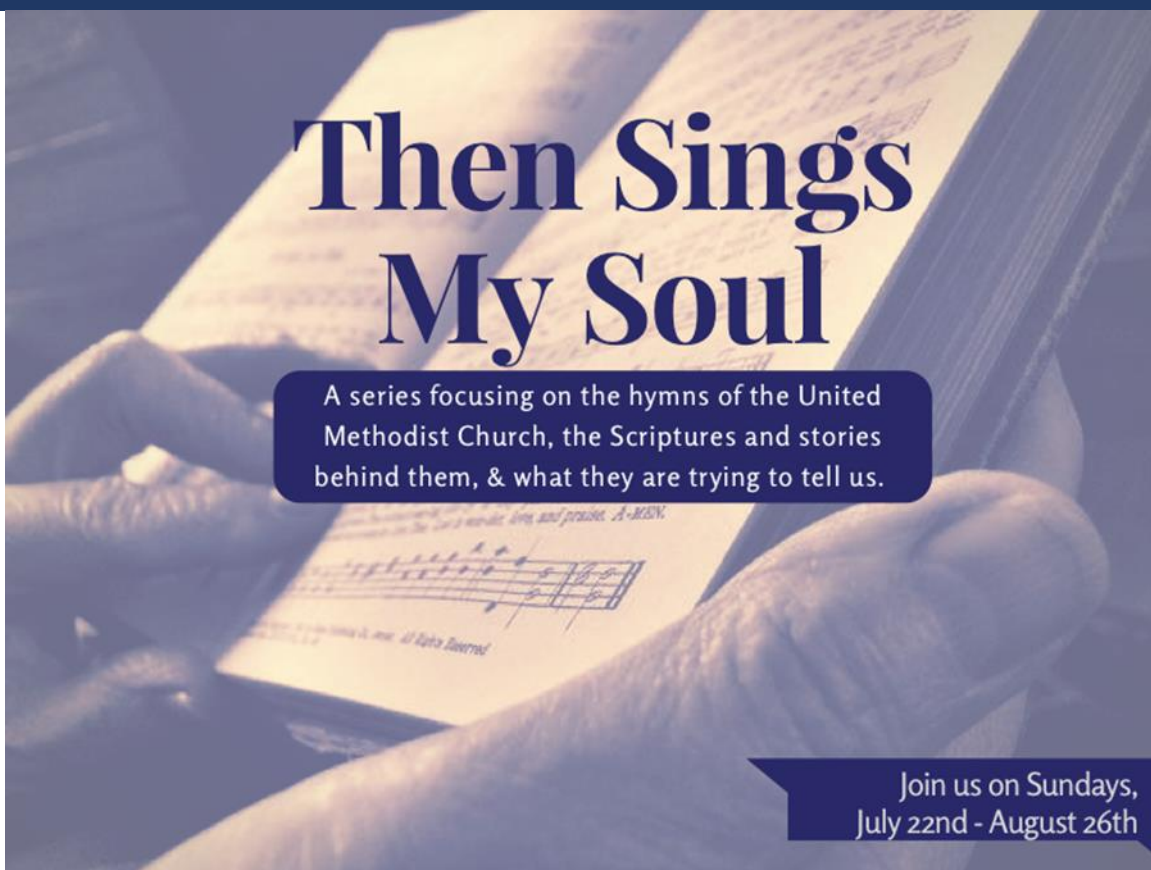

STEPHEN MINISTRY

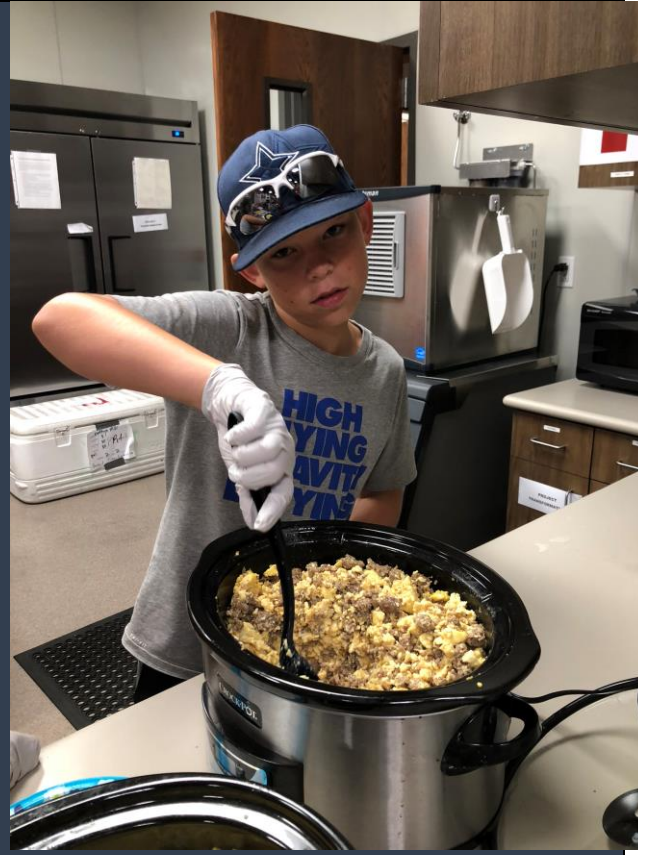
The Stephen Ministers are delivering communion to those who want communion, and in doing so we extend our communion table to those who are unable to get to church. If you would like to be put on the delivery list, please call the church office and make that request. It can be a one-time event (recovering from surgery) or normally a monthly request. We are happy and privileged to extend our communion table to you.

If you are struggling through a difficult time in life, and are experiencing grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or some other life crisis, let the Stephen Ministers help you through it. You may be unable to leave your home and want communion brought to you or you may just want someone to read the Bible to you. Stephen Ministers can be of assistance. Stephen Ministers are Christian men and women who are trained to provide one-on-one care to people who are experiencing a difficult time in life. They have a passion for bringing Christ's love and care to people during a time of need. The relationship between a care receiver and a Stephen Minister is confidential. When a care receiver's needs exceed what a Stephen Minister can provide, the Stephen Ministry team will make a referral to an appropriate mental health professional or other community resource. To get a Stephen Minister contact Pastor Kyle or Roberta Himebrook.

Some of our Stephen Ministers will be attending a H.E.R.O.E.S. Workshop. H.E.R.O.E.S. Care is a collaborative effort designed to provide complete and proactive support for members of all branches of the military and their families through pre-deployment, deployment, family reintegration and post-deployment. We have members of our congregation who served in the military and we felt this training would help us in serving them. It will also provide us with contact information to add to our resource manual.
